What You Can Do

Contact the Fayetteville City Council, the Cumberland County Board, and the Fayetteville Cumberland County Economic Development Corporation (FCEDC).

Demand an immediate end to all cooperation with Waste Energy Corp.

Also request that Waste Energy Corp. be reported to:

- The EPA and North Carolina DEQ, for failing to fully disclose project risks to residents, local officials, and FCEDC
- The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) and Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), to prevent them from targeting other communities and misleading investors.
